MINUTES OF MEETING CANDLER HILLS EAST COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT

The Regular Meeting of the Board of Supervisors of the Candler Hills East Community Development District was held on Tuesday, May 15, 2018 at 9:00 a.m. at Live Oak Hall, 8413 S.W. 80th Street, Suite 7-8, Ocala, Florida.

FIRST ORDER OF BUSINESS

Roll Call

Mr. Flint called the meeting to order and called the roll. A quorum was present.

SECOND ORDER OF BUSINESS Public

Mr. Flint: This is an opportunity for any members of the public to provide comments to the Candler Hills East Board. We ask that you come to the podium, state your name and address and try to limit your comments to three minutes. You can comment on anything on and off the agenda. Are there any public comments? Hearing none,

THIRD ORDER OF BUSINESS

Mr. Flint: The meeting was advertised in accordance with the Florida Statutes, in the Ocala Star Banner. The affidavit of publication was included in your agenda package.

FOURTH ORDER OF BUSINESS

Approval of Minutes of the February 20, 2018 Meeting

Mr. Flint: Does the Board have any changes and comments on the minutes?

Public Comment Period

Notice for Meeting

Candler Hills East CDD

Mr. Garvin: On the top of Page 3, it says "we will have through." I think a word is missing. It should say "we will work through the timing issue."

Mr. Flint: Are there any other comments or corrections?

Mr. Scherff: Yes. On Page 6, halfway down, my name is spelled wrong.

Mr. Moherek: On Page 4, "Mr. Greene" should be "Mr. Moherek."

Mr. Flint: Are there any other comments or corrections? Hearing none, we need a motion to approve the minutes as amended.

On MOTION by Mr. Scherff, seconded by Mr. Bain, with all in favor, the minutes of the February 20, 2018 meeting were approved, as amended.

FIFTH ORDER OF BUSINESS

Review and Acceptance of Draft Fiscal Year 2017 Audit Report

Mr. Flint: The CDD, as a governmental entity, is required to have an independent audit performed annually. You went through a competitive bidding process, as prescribed by the Statutes to select your independent auditor. You received a draft of the annual audit for Fiscal Year 2017. If you look at the Management Letter on Page 33, if there were any findings or recommendations by the auditor you would see that in the Management Letter. There are no findings or recommendations in the current or prior year, and they found that we complied with all of the provisions of the Auditor General's office. It's a clean audit. Are there any questions from the Board?

Mr. Scherff: On the bottom of Page 31, it says "Given these limitations during our audit, we did not identify any deficiencies in internal control that we consider to be material weaknesses. However, material weaknesses may exist that have not been identified."

Mr. Flint: That's auditor language. Are there any other questions on the audit? Not hearing any, we need a motion to accept the audit and authorize it to be transmitted to the State of Florida.

On MOTION by Mr. Moherek, seconded by Mr. Greene, with all in favor, the Fiscal Year 2017 Audit Report was accepted and staff authorized to transmit the final report to the State of Florida.

SIXTH ORDER OF BUSINESS

Consideration of Resolution 2018-01 Approving the Proposed Budget for Fiscal Year 2019 and Setting a Public Hearing

Mr. Flint: The Board, each year, is required to approve a proposed budget by June 15th of each year, and set the date, place and time of the hearing. The proposed budget does not bind the Board. We are required to transmit this proposed budget to Marion County, at least 60 days before the public hearing. We are suggesting that the public hearing take place on August 21, 2018 at 9:00 a.m., at this location. Exhibit A to the Resolution is the proposed budget. It assumes that the per unit operating and maintenance (O&M) assessment would remain the same, which is \$178 per unit per year. The operating expenses have not changed significantly, or they are not anticipated to. We have had discussions at prior meetings about the possibility of the Candler Hills HOA assuming maintenance of the stormwater ponds. That cost would be removed from this budget and added to the Candler Hills HOA budget. We are still in communication with the HOA, and believe that we can work something out in that regard; however, there's a timing issue, as the CDDs fiscal year runs from October 1 to September 30, versus the HOA's fiscal year, which runs from January 1st to December 31st. The HOA has not had a Board meeting since our last Board meeting, so they haven't taken action on this, but our hope is that there will be a decision on that issue prior to your August public hearing. In the event that there is a decision on that issue, you can lower your assessments at the public hearing and vote on a reduced budget. One of the issues is going to be the maintenance cost for the first three months of the fiscal year, October, November and December, because the HOA's new fiscal year doesn't start until January. We will be looking at that. We may have to fund the first three months of the fiscal year and then the HOA pick it up from there, if that's the decision the HOA makes. Our recommendation would be to adopt the budget with the assessments as they are, with the option of lowering them at the public hearing.

A. Attorney

Mr. Flint: Gerald, do you have a report?

Mr. Colen: I have no report at this time.

B. Engineer

There being none, the next item followed.

C. District Manager's Report

1. Approval of Check Register

Mr. Flint: You have the Check Register from February 10, 2018 through May 9, 2018, totaling \$44,353.72. The detailed register is behind the summary. There are a couple of transfers from the General Fund to the trust account for the debt service assessments, that comprise a majority of that \$44,353.72. Are there any questions? If not, we need a motion to approve the Check Register.

On MOTION by Mr. Scherff, seconded by Mr. Bain, with all in favor, the Check Register, was approved.

2. Balance Sheet and Income Statement

Mr. Flint: You have the Unaudited Financial Statements through April 30, 2018. No action is required. If the Board has any questions regarding the Unaudited Financial Statements, we can discuss those. We are 100% collected on the maintenance assessments. On a pro-rated basis, our actuals are under our prorated budget at this point of the year.

Mr. Bain: What is "Special Call?"

Mr. Flint: That is for any time someone chooses to prepay the outstanding principal on the bonds. We collect that on May 1 or November 1, depending on the timing of the prepayment. You will see a special call in the financials where the principal is paid down, associated with the home that is prepaying. Year-to-date, there's been \$55,000 in special calls, meaning that we had several prepayments. Are there any other questions on the financials? Hearing none,

3. Presentation of Number of Registered Voters – 930

Mr. Flint: Each year, we are required to announce the number of registered voters residing within the District, as of April 15th. According to the Supervisor of Elections, there are

930 registered voters within the boundaries. This is more relevant prior to the Board transiting to General Election, although the statutes still require that we report this every year. The magic number is hitting 250 registered voters, which you hit some time ago, and the Board is now fully transitioned.

Mr. Moherek: Does the 930 include snowbirds?

Mr. Flint: No. There are 930 full-time residents registered to vote with a Candler address as their permanent address.

Mr. Scherff: There could be snowbirds.

Mr. Flint: It depends on how long they are here and up there.

Mr. Moherek: How many residents do we have, presently, in Candler?

Mr. Flint: I don't know. I can tell you how many homes there are and how many registered voters, but we don't track the number of residents. Maybe the HOA has that number. No action is required.

4. Presentation of Qualifying Information and Dates

Mr. Flint: This is an informational item related to the election. The Candler Hills East Board has three seats coming up for election in November; Mr. Bain's seat, which is Seat 5, Mr. Garvin's seat, which is Seat 4 and Mr. Scherff's seat, which is Seat 1. These are elected officials and once they transition to General Election, the CDD doesn't have any involvement in the election process. we are required to put a notice in the newspaper by June 4th, which I believe we already did. That's the extent of our involvement. Once the seats transition to General Election, then the Marion County Supervisor of Elections handles the election process. They modified the statutes to include a more streamlined process for Special Districts. It used to be that people who ran for CDD seats, had to follow the same process that you would if you were going to run for County Commission or City Commission seats. Several years ago, they amended the Statutes to provide for a more streamlined process, in the event that a candidate chooses not to open a campaign account. They don't have to name a Treasurer or do that sort of reporting. They also reduced the fee. You can qualify through a petition process where you get 25 signatures of registered voters within the District or pay \$25. They provide two ways to do that. The time frames are indicated. There's a one page informational sheet from the Supervisor of Elections website. Basically, the qualifying period runs from June 18th at Noon, through June 22nd at Noon. We urge you to contact the Supervisor of Elections office to ensure that you

comply with whatever requirements they have to qualify for those seats. To be eligible to run for the three seats, you must be a registered voter living within Candler Hills East.

Dear Mr. Moherek:

It was a pleasure to speak with you yesterday. Following up from the Board meeting of the Candler Hills Neighborhood Association ("Association") held on June 26, 2018, it was resolved to have an Association representative discuss the matter further with the CHECDD ("CDD") representative.

After further discussion, it was determined that the Association could take over the contract on mowing the drainage retention areas (DRA's) located in the CDD, specifically as noted on the attached Exhibit A for DRA 1, 2, 5, 7 and 8. This is currently estimated to be in the cost range of \$50,000 annually. DRA 3, 4 and 6 are currently maintained by Sidney Colen & Associates, LTD as a part of the golf course maintenance. The Association is unable to assume full maintenance responsibility on those areas as they are the property of the CDD. Therefore any other maintenance or repair to these areas would be the responsibility of the CDD.

During our conversation on August 6, 2018, you indicated you were in agreement with this proposal. Moving forward, the CDD would need to fund the prorated costs of maintenance on these from the start of its fiscal year through December 31, 2018. The Association will then bring the additional prorated mowing costs into its budget on January 1, 2019. Any contract that the CDD has with the mowing contractor would need to be assigned to the Association and accepted by the contractor.

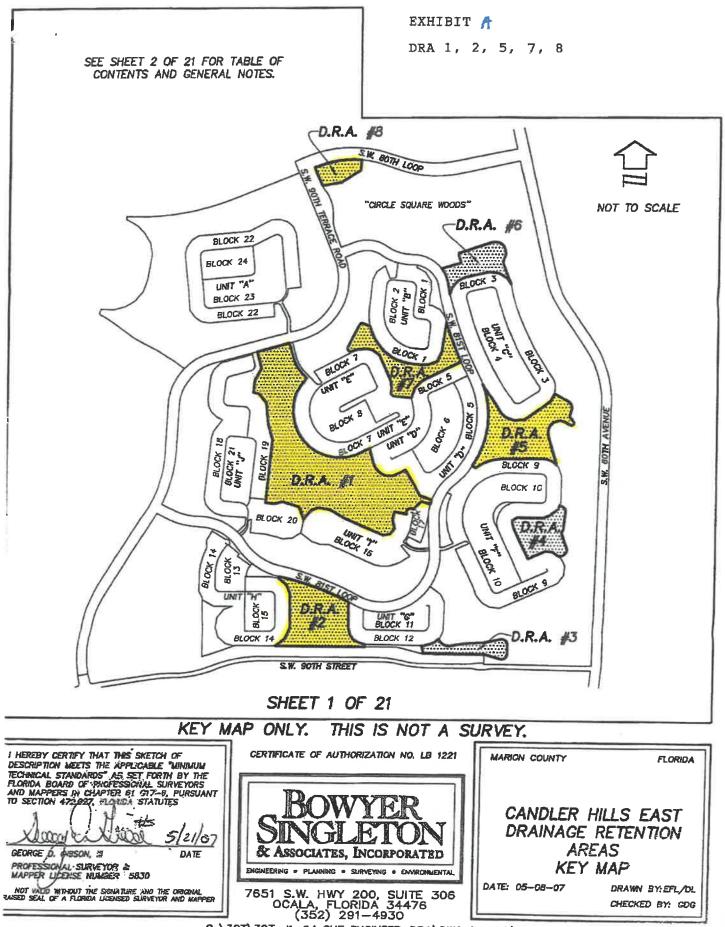
I believe this is a fair resolution for all parties.

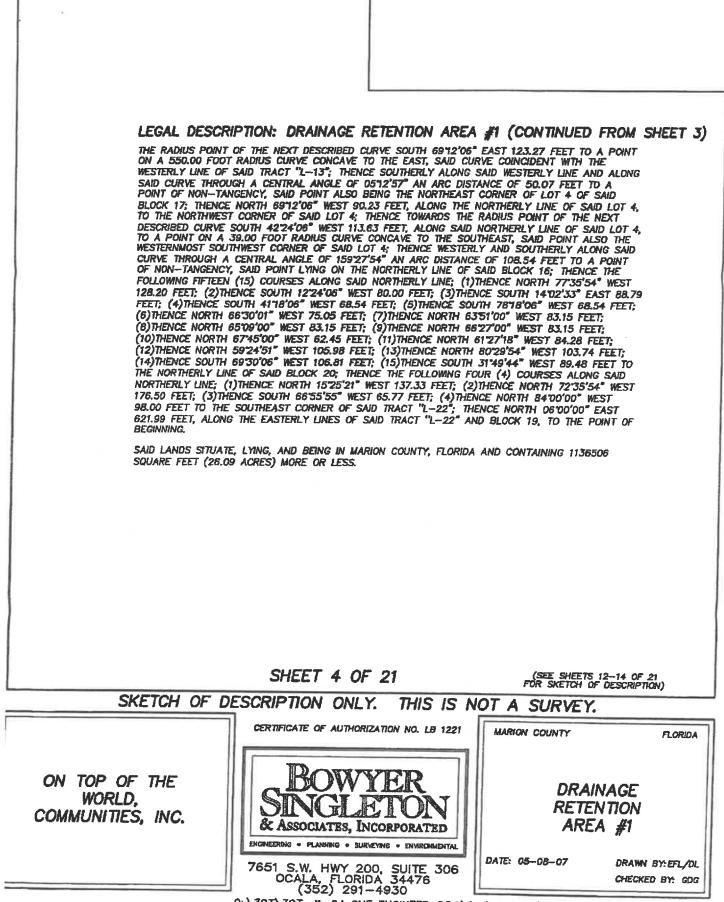

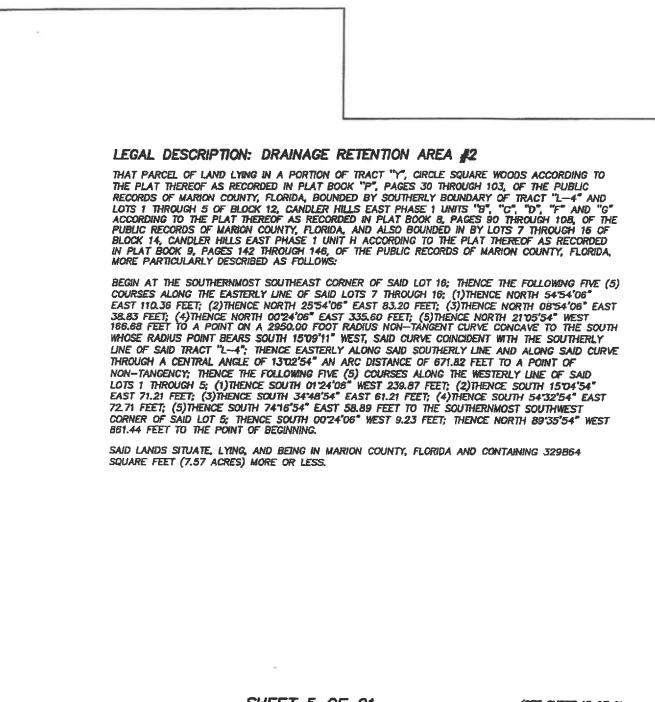

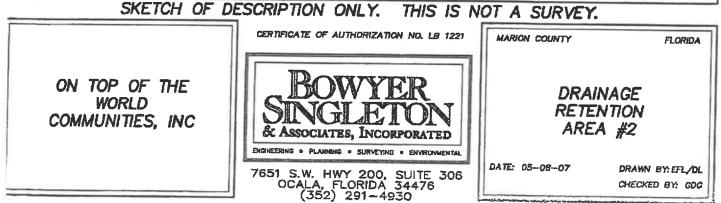

RESOLUTION 2018-02

THE ANNUAL APPROPRIATION RESOLUTION OF THE CANDLER HILLS EAST COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT (THE "DISTRICT") RELATING TO THE ANNUAL APPROPRIATIONS AND ADOPTING THE BUDGET FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING OCTOBER 1, 2018, AND ENDING SEPTEMBER 30, 2019.

WHEREAS, the District Manager has, prior to the fifteenth (15th) day in June, 2018, submitted to the Board of Supervisors (the "Board") a proposed budget for the next ensuing budget year along with an explanatory and complete financial plan for each fund of the Candler Hills East Community Development District, pursuant to the provisions of Section 190.008(2)(a), Florida Statutes; and

WHEREAS, at least sixty (60) days prior to the adoption of the proposed annual budget (the "Proposed Budget"), the District filed a copy of the Proposed Budget with the local governing authorities having jurisdiction over the area included in the District pursuant to the provisions of Section 190.008(2)(b), Florida Statutes; and

WHEREAS, the Board set August 21, 2018, as the date for a public hearing thereon and caused notice of such public hearing to be given by publication pursuant to Section 190.008(2)(a), Florida Statutes; and

WHEREAS, Section 190.008(2)(a), Florida Statutes, requires that, prior to October 1, of each year, the District Board by passage of the Annual Appropriation Resolution shall adopt a budget for the ensuing fiscal year and appropriate such sums of money as the Board deems necessary to defray all expenditures of the District during the ensuing fiscal year; and

WHEREAS, the District Manager has prepared a Proposed Budget, whereby the budget shall project the cash receipts and disbursements anticipated during a given time period, including reserves for contingencies for emergency or other unanticipated expenditures during the fiscal year.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF CANDLER HILLS EAST COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT;

Section 1. Budget

- a. That the Board of Supervisors has reviewed the District Manager's Proposed Budget, a copy of which is on file with the office of the District Manager and at the District's Records Office, and hereby approves certain amendments thereto, as shown in Section 2 below.
- b. That the District Manager's Proposed Budget, attached hereto as Exhibit "A," as amended by the Board, is hereby adopted in accordance with the provisions of

Section 190.008(2)(a), Florida Statutes, and incorporated herein by reference; provided, however, that the comparative figures contained in the adopted budget may be subsequently revised as deemed necessary by the District Manager to reflect actual revenues and expenditures for Fiscal Year 2018 and/or revised projections for Fiscal Year 2019.

c. That the adopted budget, as amended, shall be maintained in the office of the District Manager and at the District's Records Office and identified as "The Budget for Candler Hills East Community Development District for the Fiscal Year Ending September 30, 2019," as adopted by the Board of Supervisors on August 21, 2018.

Section 2. Appropriations

There is hereby appropriated out of the revenues of the Candler Hills East Community Development District, for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 2018, and ending September 30, 2019, the sum of 303,180 to be raised by the levy of assessments and/or otherwise, which sum is deemed by the Board of Supervisors to be necessary to defray all expenditures of the District during said budget year, to be divided and appropriated in the following fashion:

TOTAL GENERAL FUND	\$ 58,568
DEBT SERVICE FUND(S) - SERIES 2006A/2016	\$ 244,613
TOTAL ALL FUNDS	\$ 303,180

Section 3. Supplemental Appropriations

The Board may authorize by resolution, supplemental appropriations or revenue changes for any lawful purpose from funds on hand or estimated to be received within the fiscal year as follows:

- a. Board may authorize a transfer of the unexpended balance or portion thereof of any appropriation item.
- b. Board may authorize an appropriation from the unappropriated balance of any fund.
- c. Board may increase any revenue or income budget amount to reflect receipt of any additional unbudgeted monies and make the corresponding change to appropriations or the unappropriated balance.

The District Manager and Treasurer shall have the power within a given fund to authorize the transfer of any unexpected balance of any appropriation item or any portion thereof, provided such transfers do not exceed Ten Thousand (\$10,000) Dollars or have the effect of causing more than 10% of the total appropriation of a given program or project to be transferred previously approved transfers included. Such transfer shall not have the effect of causing a more than \$10,000 or 10% increase, previously approved transfers included, to the original budget appropriation for the receiving program. Transfers within a program or project may be approved by the Board of Supervisors. The District Manager or Treasurer must establish administrative procedures which require information on the request forms proving that such transfer requests comply with this section.

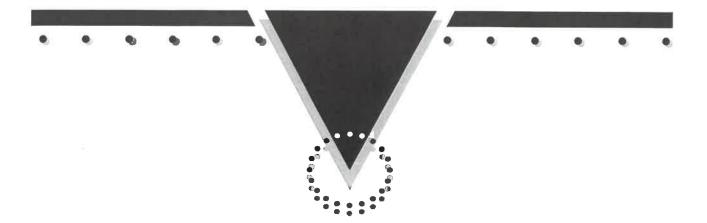

REVENUES:

Maintenance Assessments

The District will levy a non-ad valorem special assessment on all taxable property within the District, to fund all General Operating and Maintenance Expenditures for the Fiscal Year.

Interest

The District receives interest earnings from its cash balance in the SunTrust operating account.

EXPENDITURES:

Administrative:

Supervisor Fees

The Florida Statutes allows each board member to receive \$200 per meeting not to exceed \$4,800 in one year. This amount is based on 5 Supervisors attending 4 monthly meetings.

FICA Expense

Represents the Employer's share of Social Security and Medicare taxes withheld from Board of Supervisors checks.

Engineering

The District's engineer will be providing general engineering services to the District, e.g., attendance and preparation for monthly meetings, reviewing invoices, and various projects assigned as directed by the Board of Supervisors. The District currently has an agreement with Dewberry Engineers, Inc.

Trustee Fees

The District issued Series 2016 Special Assessment Refunding Bonds that are administered by a Trustee at US Bank.

Dissemination

The District is required by the Security and Exchange Commission to comply with Rule 15c2-12(b) (5) which relates to additional reporting requirements for unrated bond issues. Governmental Management Services – CF, LLC is contracted for this service.

General Fund Budget Fiscal Year 2019

Arbitrage

The District has contracted with an independent certified public accountant to annually calculate the District's Arbitrage Rebate Liability on the Series 2016 Special Assessment Refunding Bonds. The District has an agreement with Grau & Associates for this service.

Assessment Roll

Governmental Management Services – Central Florida, LLC serves as the District's collection agent and certifies the District's non-ad valorem assessments with the Marion County Tax Collector's Office.

Attorney

The District's legal counsel will be providing general legal services to the District, i.e., attendance and preparation for monthly meetings, review operating and maintenance contracts, etc. The District currently has an agreement with Gerald R. Colen, P.A.

Annual Audit

The District is required annually to conduct an audit of its financial records by an Independent Certified Public Accounting Firm.

Management Fees

The District receives Management, Accounting and Administrative services as part of a Management Agreement with Governmental Management Services – Central Florida, LLC. The services include, but are not limited to, recording and transcription of board meetings, administrative services, budget preparation, all financial reporting, annual audits, etc.

Information Technology

The District incurs costs related to the District's accounting and information systems, District's website creation and maintenance, electronic compliance with Florida Statutes and other electronic data requirements.

<u>Telephone</u>

Telephone and fax machine.

Postage

Mailing of Board Meeting agenda packages, overnight deliveries, checks for vendors and any other required correspondence.

General Fund Budget Fiscal Year 2019

Printing & Binding

Printing and Binding agenda packages for board meetings, printing of computerized checks, stationary, envelopes etc.

<u>Insurance</u>

The District's general liability & public officials liability insurance policy is with Florida Insurance Alliance. The Florida Insurance Alliance specializes in providing insurance coverage to governmental agencies.

Legal Advertising

The District is required to advertise various notices for monthly Board meetings, public hearings, etc. in a newspaper of general circulation. The District does most of its legal advertising with Ocala Star-Banner.

Other Current Charges

Bank charges and any other miscellaneous expenses that are incurred during the year.

Office Supplies

The District incurs charges for supplies that need to be purchased during the fiscal year, including copier and printer toner cartridges, paper, file folders, binders, pens, paper clips, and other such office supplies.

Dues, Licenses & Subscriptions

The District is required to pay an annual fee to the Department of Economic Opportunity for \$175. This is the only expense under this category for the District.

MAINTENANCE:

Retention Ponds/Owl Preserve DRA

The District has contracted with Sharp Site Services, LLC to provide landscape maintenance services. The District will maintain the Retention Ponds/DRA from October 1, 2018 until December 31, 2018. After this time, the Candler Hills HOA has agreed to take over maintenance. The District will continue to be responsible for any repairs including sinkholes.

Contingencies

To record the cost of any maintenance expenses not properly classified in any of the other accounts.

RESOLUTION 2018-03

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE CANDLER HILLS EAST COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT IMPOSING SPECIAL ASSESSMENTS AND CERTIFYING AN ASSESSMENT ROLL; PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the Candler Hills East Community Development District ("the District") is a local unit of special-purpose government established pursuant to Chapter 190, Florida Statutes for the purpose of providing, operating and maintaining infrastructure improvements, facilities and services to the lands within the District; and

WHEREAS, the District is located in Marion County, Florida (the "County"); and

WHEREAS, the District has constructed or acquired various infrastructure improvements and provides certain services in accordance with the District's adopted Improvement Plan and Chapter 190, Florida Statutes; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of the District ("Board") hereby determines to undertake various operations and maintenance activities described in the District's budget for Fiscal Year 2018-2019 ("Operations and Maintenance Budget"), attached hereto as Exhibit "A" and incorporated by reference herein; and

WHEREAS, the District must obtain sufficient funds to provide for the operation and maintenance of the services and facilities provided by the District as described in the District's budget for Fiscal Year 2018-2019; and

WHEREAS, the provision of such services, facilities, and operations is a benefit to lands within the District; and

WHEREAS, Chapter 190, Florida Statutes, provides that the District may impose special assessments on benefitted lands within the District; and

WHEREAS, The District has previously levied an assessment for debt service, which the District desires to collect on the tax roll for platted lots pursuant to the Uniform Method and which is also indicated on Exhibit "A"; and

WHEREAS, Chapter 197, Florida Statutes, provides a mechanism pursuant to which such special assessments may be placed on the tax roll and collected by the local tax collector ("Uniform Method"); and

WHEREAS, the District has previously evidenced its intention to utilize this Uniform Method; and

WHEREAS, the District has approved an Agreement with the Tax Collector of the County to provide for the collection of the special assessments under the Uniform Method; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interests of the District to proceed with the imposition of the special assessments; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interests of the District to adopt the Assessment Roll of the Candler Hills East Community Development District (the "Assessment Roll") attached to this Resolution as Exhibit "B" and incorporated as a material part of this Resolution by this reference, and to certify the Assessment Roll on platted property to the County Tax Collector pursuant to the Uniform Method; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interests of the District to permit the District Manager to amend the Assessment Roll, certified to the County Tax Collector by this Resolution, as the Property Appraiser updates the property roll for the County, for such time as authorized by Florida law.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE CANDLER HILLS EAST COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT:

SECTION 1. BENEFIT. The provision of the services, facilities, and operations as described in Exhibit "A" confer a special and peculiar benefit to the lands within the District, which benefits exceed or equal the costs of the assessments. The allocation of the costs to the specially benefitted lands is shown in Exhibits "A" and "B."

SECTION 2. ASSESSMENT INPOSITION. A special assessment for operation and maintenance as provided for in Chapter 190, Florida Statutes, is hereby imposed and levied on benefitted lands within the District in accordance with Exhibits "A" and "B." The lien of the special assessments for operations and maintenance imposed and levied by this Resolution shall be effective upon passage of this Resolution.

SECTION 3. COLLECTION. The collection of the operation and maintenance special assessments shall be at the same time and in the same manner as County taxes in accordance with the Uniform Method. The District shall also collect its previously levied debt service assessment pursuant to the Uniform method, as indicated on Exhibits "A" and "B."

SECTION 4. ASSESSMENT ROLL. The District's Assessment Roll, attached to this Resolution as Exhibit "B," is hereby certified to the County Tax Collector and shall be collected by the County Tax Collector in the same manner and time as County taxes. The proceeds there from shall be paid to the Candler Hills East Community Development District.

SECTION 5. ASSESSMENT ROLL AMENDMENT. The District Manager shall keep appraised of all updates made to the County property roll by Property Appraiser after the date of this Resolution, and shall amend the District's Assessment Roll in accordance with any such updates, for such time as authorized by Florida law, to the County property roll. After any amendment of the Assessment Roll, the District Manager shall file the updates to the tax roll in the District records.

SECTION 6. SEVERABILITY. The invalidity or unenforceability of any one or more provisions of this Resolution shall not affect the validity or enforceability of the remaining portions of this Resolution, or any part thereof.

SECTION 7. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Resolution shall take effect upon the passage and adoption of this Resolution by the Board of Supervisors of the Candler Hills East Community Development District.
